Maximums for TTD, Death and Member Amputations -- Minimums for Death, PTD and Member Amputations
The maximum TTD, death benefit and member amputation rate is set at 133 1/3% of the state's average weekly wage. The minimum death benefit, permanent total disability (PTD) and member amputation rate is set at 50% of the state average weekly wage. The maximum and the minimum rates change twice a year on January 15 and July 15. The member amputation minimum rate applies to accident dates after 2/1/06.

<u>Wage Differential Claims</u> The Maximum Wage Differential Rate for dates of accident after 2/1/06 is the State AWW in effect on the date of accident. Wage Differential Benefits for accidents which occurred after 9/1/11 terminate at age 67 or last up to a maximum of five years from the date of a final decision, whichever is later.

Finger and Toe amputations – A measurable bone loss of all or part of distal phalanx equals 50% loss of the digit. Any bone loss beyond distal phalanx and into the middle phalanx equals 100% loss of the digit. The hand is only worth 190 weeks for repetitive trauma carpal tunnel syndrome cases.
